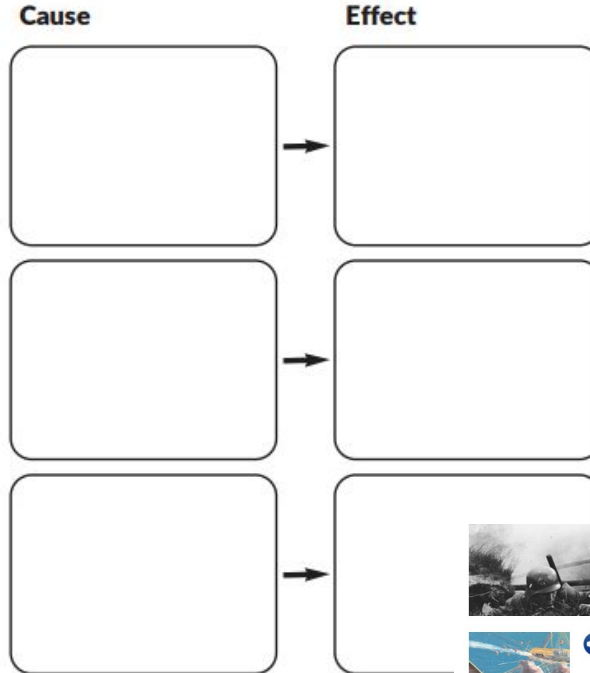

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World War II killed more people and destroyed more property than any other war in history. It began on September 1, 1939, and ended on September 2, 1945. World War II began in Europe but spread to nearly every part of the world, including northern Africa, Asia, Australia, and the Pacific Ocean. Battles were fought on land, at sea, and in the air.



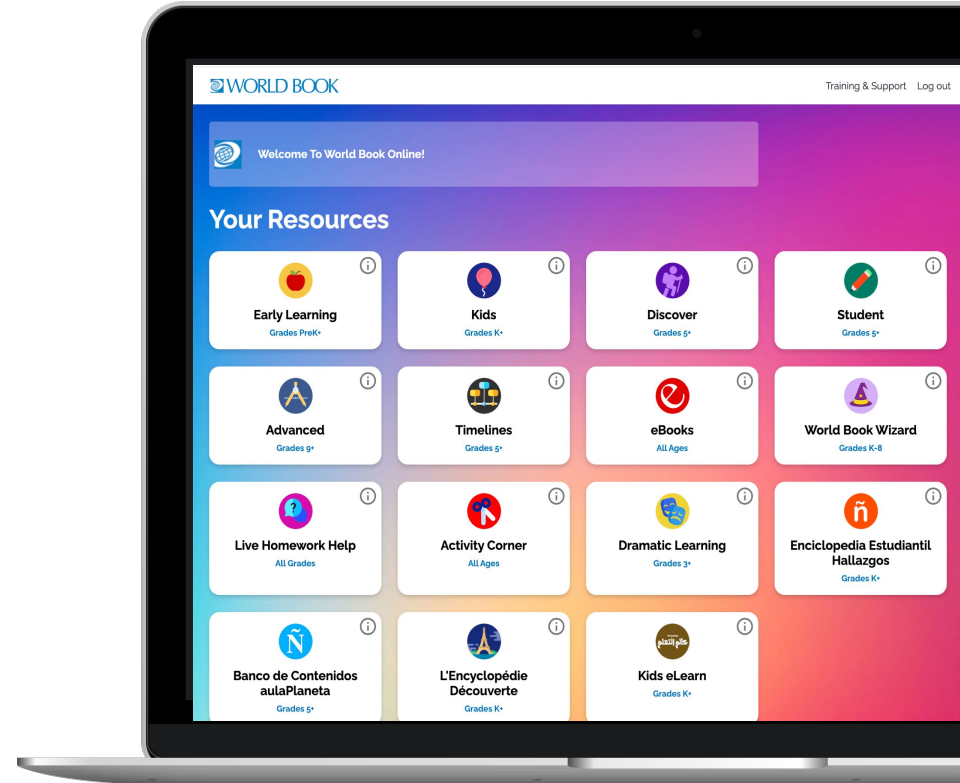
The biggest sea battles of World War II took place between airplanes and ships.



More than 20 million soldiers died during the six years of the war. An even greater number of men, women, and children also died from bombs, sickness, or lack of food. Millions of people died as prisoners in Germany's death camps. The war left many other people without homes or jobs.

Two groups of nations fought World War II. One group, called the Axis, was made up of eight countries and was led by Germany, Italy, and Japan. The other group, called the Allies, was made up of 50 countries and was led by Britain, China, the Soviet Union, and the United States.
